

TAKE ACTION TO PROTECT THE ANDRATX COASTLINE!

The Xarxa Dragonera Blava, a participatory project by the Andratx community, has developed these **guidelines to protect the precious environment of Sa Dragonera** for outdoor activities, sailing, and other aquatic activities.



Take your waste with you when you leave (including paper and organic leftovers!).



Plan your visit in advance and make sure you're well-equipped for your excursion.



Use only marked trails and paths. This is to avoid soil erosion in the area.



Wild camping is prohibited in the Sierra de Tramuntana.



You are in one of the driest forest areas of Mallorca. Using fire is prohibited.



Keep your dog in check! Unleashed dogs can eat bird eggs and scare them away. And don't forget to pick up after your dog!



Many species (some of them protected) nest and live in this area. Loud noises will scare them off!



The use of drones is prohibited in this area. Their flight and noise threaten the well-being of the various bird species living here.

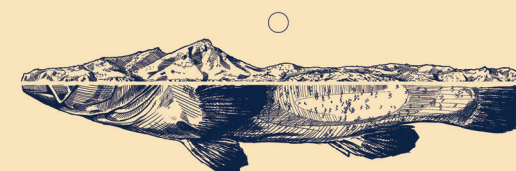

SA DRAGONERA PROTECTED AREA

The island of Sa Dragonera is a highly valued **protected area**. Thanks to its location, marine currents and characteristic winds, the area is home to a great diversity of habitats and species, both terrestrial and marine.

The protected area encompasses a variety of protection legal frameworks, including a Natural Park and the islets of Es Pantaleu, Sa Mitjana, and Els Calafats.

It also features a **Marine Reserve of Fishing Interest** with various zones: some areas are restricted from all activities, while others permit only diving and snorkelling.

Additionally, the area is designated as a Site of Community Importance (SCI) and a Site under the Birds Directive (SPA) within the **Natura 2000 Network**.

GUIDELINES FOR AQUATIC ACTIVITIES AND NAVIGATION



Respect Posidonia meadows, the lungs of the Mediterranean. Anchoring on it is prohibited by law!



Reduce your speed in the waters of the marine reserve. It is forbidden to navigate faster than 10 knots.



Grey and black water may only be discharged at designated locations within the port or at least 12 miles from the coast.



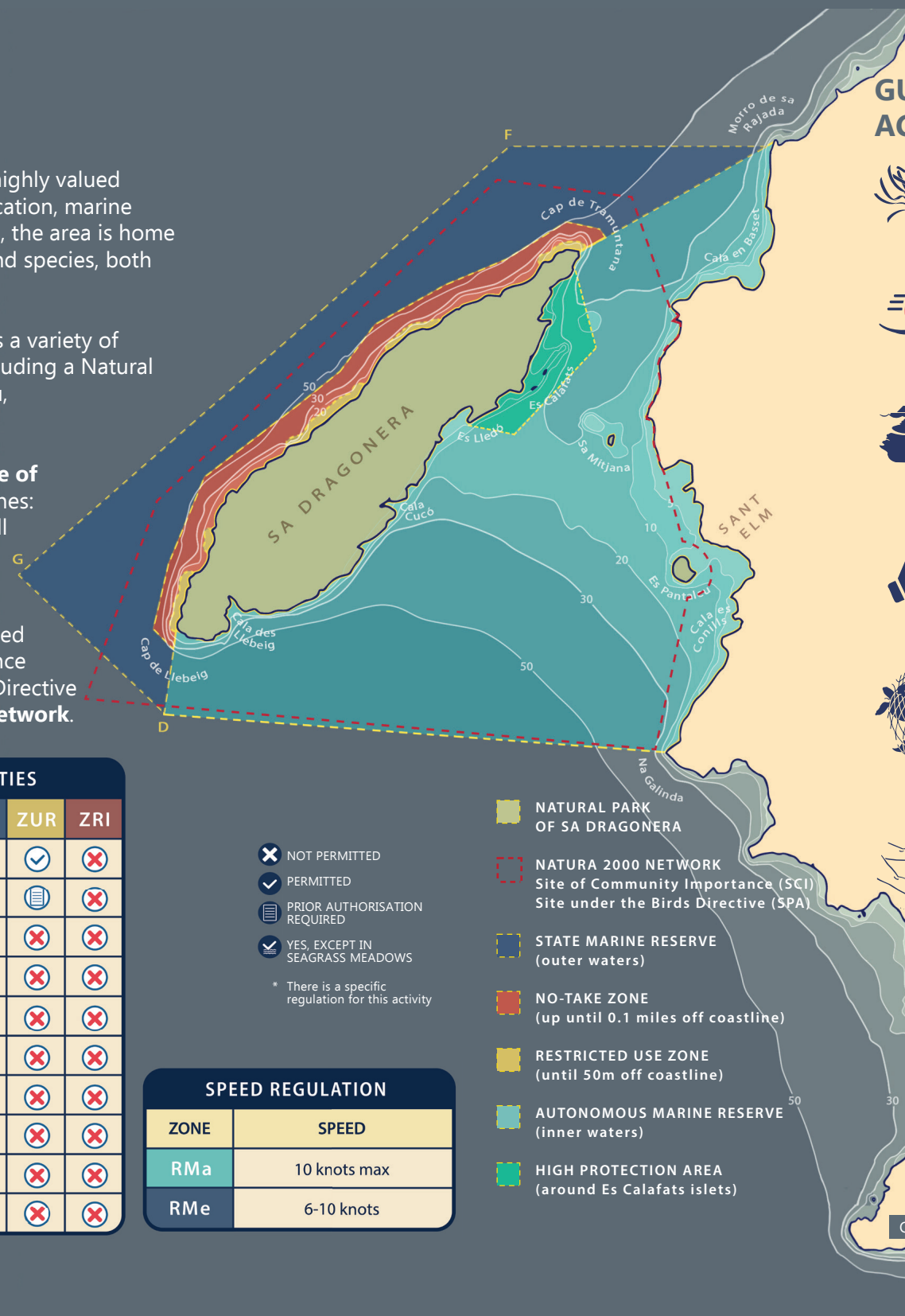
Marine species communicate through sound. Noise (engine, music, etc.) disorients them and affects their health.



If you find an animal entangled or trapped in plastic, do not try to remove the plastic. Keep the animal safe and call 112 immediately. Also, call if you find any drifting fishing nets.



Pay attention to your flotation, avoid touching the seafloor, and do not disturb or chase marine species.
